Business Incubators

Business incubators provide facility and management assistance for emerging growth companies. They offer new and existing companies affordable office, manufacturing or kitchen space, resource libraries, shared services and office equipment, meeting rooms and access to professional administrative services. The objectives of these centers are to stimulate small business growth, assist with the beginning stages of start-up, direct new businesses toward realistic and achievable goals and support cultural and neighborhood revitalization. U.S. Small Business Administration (“SBA”) created in 1953 is federal executive agency created to aid, counsel, assist and protect the interests of small business concerns. Services provided include:

Help in developing and maintaining business plans.

Financial counseling.

Marketing and contract capture assistance.

Improving management practices.

Equity and debt financing – several loan programs.

Obtaining surety bonds.

Information on (i) sole source; (ii) limited competition; and (iii) subcontracting under prime federal contracts.

Understanding SBA joint venture, teaming and mentor-protégé programs.

Assistance in purchasing federal surplus property.
